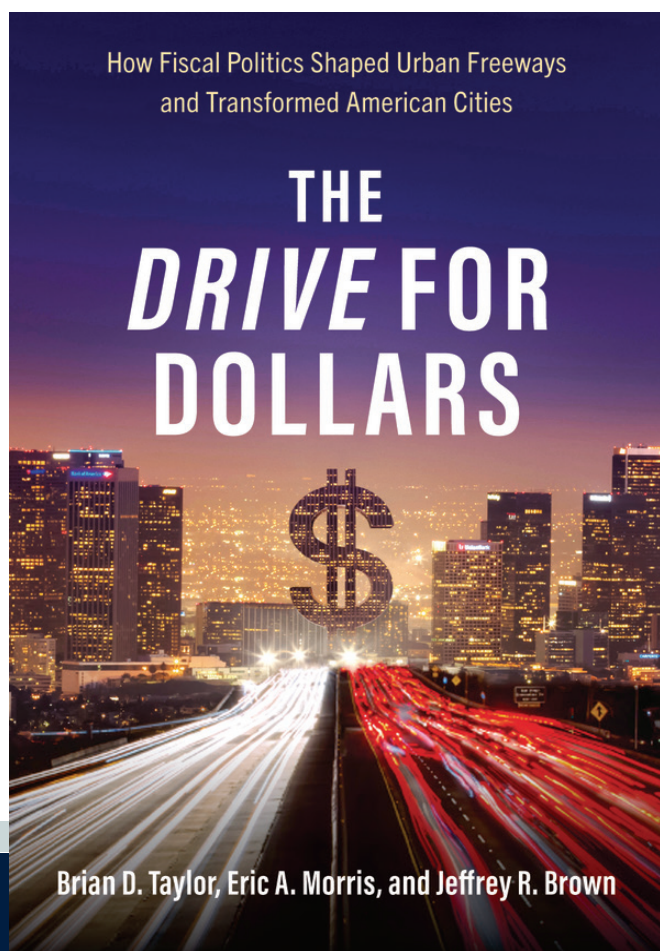


The Drive for Dollars
